A native of Miami, Florida, Dr. Corella has performed as a soloist and clinician at colleges and universities throughout the United States. Additionally, Dr. Corella is widely recognized as a traditional jazz tubist, having played with nearly every traditional jazz band in the Washington and Baltimore metropolitan arenas. He is currently the tuba/euphonium professor at George Washington University and Georgetown University, and is the founder and Executive Director for the Serapis Foundation, whose mission is to promote music education and appreciation. Dr. Corella has been a member of the United States Air Force Band since 1985 and currently serves as the Band's Special Events Manager. Corella completed his Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in May of 2005, as the school's first-ever graduate in tuba performance.
